Dear Friends,

My wife is this week doing some continuing education, and in the new world after COVID this means that she locks herself in her office with a big cup of coffee, only to come out of her bolt hole to top off the coffee. What she does is a writer's conference for she is an English major and thus aspires to writing a book. Truth is, one of the few things we have in common is that we are both very literate. She is, however, haunted by a need for perfection and as she is no John Milton, or whoever wrote their manuscripts in ink without any corrections, she edits her stories to death. Furthermore, the poor soul tries to be - remember, English major? - profound while I write purely for the fun of it (as you might be able to tell).
