³And so, brothers and sisters, I could not speak to you as spiritual people but rather as fleshly, as infants in Christ. ²I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for solid food. Even now you are still not ready, ³for you are still fleshly.

For as long as there is jealousy and quarreling among you, are you not fleshly and behaving according to human inclinations?

⁴ For when one says, "I belong to Paul," and another, "I belong to Apollos," are you not all too human? ⁵ What then is Apollos? What is Paul?
